### SEPTEMBER

**1** Architect **Douglas Garofalo** has his first solo exhibit at the Art Institute of Chicago ([artic.edu](http://artic.edu)). The exhibit showcases the range of the architect's work, from the theoretical Camouflage House to the recently completed Hyde Park Art Center, and features drawings, models, and digital media. **Through October 8.**

**2** This year marks the 150th anniversary of the birth of architect Louis Sullivan. The Chicago Architecture Foundation, in conjunction with the Art Institute of Chicago, invites participants to explore Sullivan's work in the Loop with **Louis Sullivan: Lost and Found**, a two-hour-plus walking tour that runs Wednesdays and Saturdays through October 21. Reservations required (312-922-3432, ext. 226; [architecture.org](http://architecture.org)).

**3** The docent-led **Historic Pullman Foundation Tour** is a 90-minute walk showcasing



architecturally significant structures and homes in the area (773-785-8901; [pullmanil.org](http://pullmanil.org); see also October 1).

**9** The Museum of Contemporary Art ([mca-chicago.org](http://mca-chicago.org)) hosts **Sustainable Architecture in Chicago: Works in Progress**, an exhibit focused on environmentally sound build-

Participants travel by deluxe motor coach for a guided tour of the Farnsworth House (in Plano, 58 miles southwest of Chicago), as well as a selection of Mies's most important buildings in the city (312-922-3432, [architecture.org](http://architecture.org); see also October 15 and 26).

**16 ArchiTrek: Pedal Oak Park** guides sightseers on a 90-minute bike ride through the Frank Lloyd Wright-rich streets of Oak Park (708-848-1976; [wrightplus.org](http://wrightplus.org)).

**17** The Chicago Architecture Foundation hosts two separate **Bungalows by Bus** tours (reservations required: 312-922-3432, ext. 240; [architecture.org](http://architecture.org)), which tell the story of the classic brick bungalow, 80,000 of which were built in Chicago between World War I and the Great Depression. This tour, the north route, includes the neighborhoods of Ravenswood Manor, Portage Park, and Galewood. (See October 15 for south route.)

**22** The 48th annual **Hinsdale Antiques Show** brings in dealers and designers featuring wares from all over the world. Displays and rooms are organized by origin and type of antiques. New York interior designer Eric Cohler is the keynote speaker (at 10 a.m.

Friday). A special, reservation-only preview party (\$125) takes place Thursday evening. At the Community House, 415 W. Eighth St., Hinsdale, 630-323-7500. **Through September 24.**

**22** **The DreamHome exhibit at the Merchandise Mart** ([merchandiseart.com](http://merchandiseart.com)) is an opportunity to see what nine local interior designers, including Nate Berkus and Eva Quateman, have done with different rooms of one harmonious "dream home," incorporating products available through the Merchandise Mart. **Through December 23.**

**24** A walking tour offered by the **Chicago Architecture Foundation** (312-922-3432; [architecture.org](http://architecture.org)) winds through Wicker Park, a neighborhood listed on the National Register of Historic Places. Known as the Polish Gold Coast, this area is rich in eclectic architecture, including many well-preserved Victorian residences.

**29** The largest and longest-running show of its kind in the Chicago area, the **Old House New House Home Show** at Pheasant Run Resort in St. Charles, hosts 300 home specialists and their displays, services, and workshops (630-515-1160; [kennedyproductions.com](http://kennedyproductions.com)). **Through October 1.**

## OCTOBER

**1** Another 90-minute **Historic Pullman Foundation Tour** of significant homes and other structures in the area. (See September 3.)

**7** **Discover Design at the Merchandise Mart** ([merchandiseart.com](http://merchandiseart.com)) aims to educate and inspire the public with events including "designer speed dating," a cooking demonstration by chef Jean Joho, and a panel discussion with DreamHome designers. (See September 22.)

**15** The Chicago Architecture Foundation hosts another **Bungalows by Bus** tour, this time of the south route, visiting the neighborhoods of McKinley Park, Gage Park, Chicago Lawn, and Chatham. (See September 17 for details and for north route.)

**15, 26** More **Farnsworth House Plus** tours from the Chicago Architecture Foundation. (See September 10 and 28.)

**20** The **Arlington Park Fall Antique Show** (708-366-2710) at the Arlington Park racetrack features more than 150 dealers from across the country. **Through October 22.**
